Coordinator for Counterterrorism, with the rank and status of Ambassador at Large

Agency: U.S. Department of State

Position Summary: The incumbent serves as an advisor to the Secretary and other Department officials on counterterrorism policy, strategy, threats, and operations. The Coordinator acts as the Secretary's representative in international meetings and forges partnerships with non-state actors, multilateral organizations, and foreign governments to advance the counterterrorism objectives and national security of the United States. The incumbent takes a leading role in developing coordinated policies and strategies to defeat terrorists abroad and in securing the cooperation of international partners. In all activities, the Coordinator is guided by the National Security Strategy and the National Strategy for Combating Terrorism. The Coordinator directs the Department's counterterrorism programs and manages the Bureau of Counterterrorism (CT). The incumbent coordinates closely with the six regional Assistant Secretaries, the Assistant Secretary for International Organization Affairs, the Assistant Secretary for Diplomatic Security, the Assistant Secretary for International Narcotics and Law Enforcement, the Assistant Secretary for Intelligence and Research, the Assistant Secretary for International Security and Non-Proliferation, the Assistant Secretary for Economic and Business Affairs, the Assistant Secretary for Public Affairs, the Assistant Secretary for Political-Military Affairs, the Legal Advisor, the Assistant Secretary for Legislative Affairs, and with senior officials from across the interagency.
