2	Congress makes the following findings:
3	(1) On September 1, 2019, Hurricane Dorian
4.	made landfall in the Bahamas as a category 5 hurri-

5 cane with sustained winds over 180 miles per hour.

- (2) Between September 1, 2019, and September 3, 2019, the islands of the Bahamas and the Bahamian people were subjected to burricane-force winds, heavy rains, and extensive flooding that destroyed critical infrastructure, decimated houses and property, and claimed the lives of at least 50 individuals.
- (3) The International Federation of the Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies stated that more than 60,000 individuals in the Bahamas lack access to clean drinking water as a result of the devastation caused by Hurricane Dorian.
- (4) The World Food Programme indicates that more than 60,000 individuals in the Bahamas will require food relief as a result of the destruction caused by Hurricane Dorian.
- (5) The Secretary of Homeland Security may, under section 244 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1254a), designate a foreign state that has experienced an environmental disaster so as to provide temporary protected status in the United

5	(a) Designation.—
6	(1) In general.—For purposes of section 244
7	of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C.
8	1254a), the Bahamas shall be treated as if it had
9	been designated under subsection (b)(1)(B) of that
10	section, subject to the provisions of this section.
11	(2) Period of Designation.—The initial pe-
12	riod of the designation referred to in paragraph (1)
