A BILL

To condition assistance to the West Bank and Gaza on steps by the Palestinian Authority to end violence and terrorism against Israeli citizens and United States Citizens.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the "Taylor Force Act". 4

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1 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

2 Congress makes the following findings:

3 (1) The Palestinian Authority's practice of pay4 ing salaries to terrorists serving in Israeli prisons, as
5 well as to the families of deceased terrorists, is an
6 incentive to commit acts of terror.

7 (2) The United States does not provide direct
8 budgetary support to the Palestinian Authority. The
9 United States does pay certain debts held by the
10 Palestinian Authority and fund programs which the
11 Palestinian Authority would otherwise be responsible
12 for.

(3) The United States Government supports community-based programs in the West Bank and Gaza
that provide for basic human needs, such as food,
water, health, shelter, protection, education and livelihoods, and that promote peace and development.

18 (4) Since fiscal year 2015, annual appropria-19 tions legislation has provided for the reduction of 20Economic Support Fund aid for the Palestinian Au-21 thority "by an amount the Secretary determines is 22 equivalent to the amount expended by the Palestinian 23 Authority as payments for acts of terrorism by indi-24 viduals who are imprisoned after being fairly tried 25 and convicted for acts of terrorism and by individuals

who died committing acts of terrorism during the pre vious calendar year".

3 SEC. 3. SENSE OF CONGRESS.

4 Congress—

5 (1) calls on the Palestinian Authority to stop 6 these payments and repeal the laws authorizing 7 them;

8 (2) calls on all donor countries providing budg-9 etary assistance to the Palestinian Authority to 10 cease direct budgetary support until the Palestinian 11 Authority stops all payments incentivizing terror;

(3) supports the creation of a general welfare
system, available to all Palestinian citizens within
the jurisdictional control of the Palestinian Authority;

16 (4) urges the United States Permanent Rep-17 resentative to the United Nations to use that posi-18 tion to highlight the issue of Palestinian Authority 19 payments for acts of terrorism and to urge other 20 member nations of the Security Council and the 21 General Assembly to join the United States in call-22 ing on the Palestinian Authority to end this system 23 immediately; and

(5) urges the Department of State to use its bi-lateral and multilateral engagements with all govern-

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ments and organizations committed to the cause of
 peace to highlight the issue of Palestinian Authority
 payments for acts of terrorism and join the United
 States in calling on the Palestinian Authority to end
 this system immediately.

6 SEC. 4. LIMITATION ON ASSISTANCE TO THE WEST BANK 7 AND GAZA.

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Funds appropriated or otherwise 9 made available for assistance under chapter 4 of part II 10 of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2346 11 et seq.; relating to Economic Support Fund) and available 12 for assistance for the West Bank and Gaza that directly 13 benefit the Palestinian Authority may only be made avail-14 able for such purpose if the Secretary of State certifies in writing to the appropriate congressional committees 15 16 that the Palestinian Authority—

(1) is taking credible steps to end acts of violence against Israeli citizens and United States citizens that are perpetrated by individuals under its jurisdictional control, such as the March 2016 attack
that killed former United States Army officer Taylor
Force, a veteran of the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan;

24 (2) has terminated payments for acts of ter-25 rorism against Israeli citizens and United States

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citizens to any individual, after being fairly tried,
 who has been imprisoned for such acts of terrorism
 and to any individual who died committing such acts
 of terrorism, including to a family member of such
 individuals; and;

6 (3) has revoked any law, decree, regulation, or 7 document authorizing or implementing a system of 8 compensation for imprisoned individuals that uses 9 the sentence or period of incarceration of an indi-10 vidual to determine the level of compensation paid-; 11 and

(4) is publicly condemning such acts of violence
and is taking steps to investigate or is cooperating in
investigations of such acts to bring the perpetrators to
justice.

16 (b) EXCEPTION.—The limitation on assistance under
17 subsection (a) shall not apply to payments made to the
18 East Jerusalem Hospital Network.

(c) RULE OF CONSTRUCTION.—Amounts withheld
pursuant to this section shall be deemed to satisfy any
similar withholding or reduction required under any other
provision of law.

23 SEC. 5. CONTINUOUS CERTIFICATION.

Funds appropriated or otherwise made available for assistance under chapter 4 of part II of the Foreign AsDAV17E06

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sistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2346 et seq.; relating to 1 2 Economic Support Fund) and available for assistance for 3 the West Bank and Gaza may only be made available for such purpose if, not later than 180 days after the date 4 5 of the enactment of this Act, and every 180 days thereafter, the Secretary of State certifies in writing to the ap-6 7 propriate congressional committees that the Palestinian 8 Authority is taking credible and verifiable steps to end 9 acts of violence against Israeli citizens and United States 10 citizens that are perpetrated by individuals under its juris-11 dictional control.

12 SEC. 6. PALESTINIAN AUTHORITY ACCOUNTABILITY FUND.

(a) ESTABLISHMENT OF FUND.—There is established
in the Treasury a fund to be known as the "Palestinian
Authority Accountability Fund" (PAAF). The PAAF shall
consist of funds withheld under sections 4 and 5.

17 (b) INVESTMENTS.—The Secretary of State shall invest 18 funds in the PAAF in an interest-bearing obligation of the 19 United States Government, or an obligation that has its 20 principal and interest guaranteed by the Government, that 21 the Secretary determines has a maturity suitable for the 22 Fund.

23 (c) USE OF FUNDS.—Funds from the PAAF may be
24 made available upon a certification by the Secretary of

State that the Palestinian Authority has met the conditions
 set forth in section 4(a).

3 (d) DISPOSITION OF UNUSED FUNDS.—On the date
4 that is one year after the date of the enactment of this Act,
5 and annually thereafter, all funds that are in the PAAF
6 shall be withdrawn and made available to the Department
7 of State for the purpose of assistance other than that deemed
8 benefitting the Palestinian Authority.

9 SEC. 67. ANNUAL REPORT.

(a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after the
date of the enactment of this Act, and annually thereafter,
the Secretary of State shall submit to the appropriate congressional committees a report including at a minimum
the following elements:

(1) An estimate of the amount expended by the
Palestinian Authority during the previous calendar
year as payments for acts of terrorism by individuals
who are imprisoned for such acts.

(2) An estimate of the amount expended by the
Palestinian Authority during the previous calendar
year as payments to the families of deceased individuals who committed an act of terrorism.

23 (3) An overview of Palestinian laws, decrees,
24 regulations, or documents in effect the previous cal-

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1	endar year that authorize or implement any pay-
2	ments reported under paragraphs (1) and (2) .
3	(4) A description of United States Government

policy, efforts, and engagement with the Palestinian
Authority in order to confirm the revocation of any
law, decree, regulation, or document in effect the
previous calendar year that authorizes or implements
any payments reported under paragraphs (1) and
(2).

10 (5) A description of United States Government 11 policy, efforts, and engagement with other govern-12 ments, and at the United Nations, to highlight the 13 issue of Palestinian payments for acts of terrorism 14 and to urge other nations to join the United States 15 in calling on the Palestinian Authority to end this 16 system immediately.

(b) FORM OF REPORT.—The report required by subsection (a) shall be submitted in unclassified form but may
include a classified annex.

20 SEC. 78. APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES DE-

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In this Act, the term "appropriate congressional committees" means—
