global challenges, undermining the security of the United States and countries around the world.

- (2) The Russian Federation has vetoed more than a dozen United Nations Security Council resolutions dealing with Syria since the beginning of the conflict in Syria in 2011, including resolutions dealing with the use of chemical weapons, the humanitarian situation in Syria, and violations of human rights.
- (3) In recent years, the Russian Federation has blocked United Nations Security Council action related to numerous security challenges, including those in Ukraine, Yemen, and Venezuela.
- (4) The Russian Federation continues to impede efforts by the United Nations Security Council to enforce sanctions with respect to North Korea, including sanctions relating to North Korean laborers and exports of petroleum products.

## (b) Report Required.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of State shall submit to the Committee on Foreign Relations of the Senate and the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the House of Representatives an unclassified report on Russian obstruction of
