1 SECTION 1. APPROVAL OF AGREEMENT FOR COOPERATION 2 **BETWEEN** THE GOVERNMENT OF THE 3 UNITED STATES OF AMERICA AND THE GOV-4 ERNMENT OF THE KINGDOM OF NORWAY 5 CONCERNING PEACEFUL USES OF NUCLEAR 6 ENERGY.

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding the provisions 8 for congressional consideration of a proposed agreement 9 for cooperation in subsection d. of section 123 of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954 (42 U.S.C. 2153), the Agree-10 11 ment for Cooperation Between the Government of the United States of America and the Government of the 12 13 Kingdom of Norway Concerning Peaceful Uses of Nuclear Energy, done at Washington June 11, 2016, may be 14 brought into effect on or after the date of the enactment 15 16 of this Act, as if all the requirements in such section for consideration of such agreement had been satisfied, sub-17 18 ject to subsection (b).

19 (b) APPLICABILITY OF ATOMIC ENERGY ACT OF 20 1954 AND OTHER PROVISIONS OF LAW.—Upon entering into effect, the agreement referred to in subsection (a) 21 22 shall be subject to the provisions of the Atomic Energy 23 Act of 1954 (42 U.S.C. 2011 et seq.) and any other appli-24 cable United States law as if such agreement had come 25 into effect in accordance with the requirements of section 123 of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954 (42 U.S.C. 2153). 26
