## RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of the Senate on the necessity of maintaining the United Nations arms embargo on South Sudan until conditions for peace, stability, democracy, and development exist.

- 1        *Resolved*, That it is the sense of the Senate that—
  - 2                (1) the signatories to the Revitalized Agreement
  - 3                on the Resolution of the Conflict in the Republic of
  - 4                South Sudan, signed on September 12, 2018, have
  - 5                delayed implementation, leading to continued conflict
  - 6                and instability in South Sudan;
  - 7                (2) despite years of fighting, 2 peace agreements, punitive actions by the international commu-

1       nity, and widespread suffering among civilian popu-  
2       lations, the leaders of South Sudan have failed to  
3       build sustainable peace;

4                 (3) the United Nations arms embargo on South  
5       Sudan, most recently extended by 1 year to May 31,  
6       2022, through United Nations Security Council Res-  
7       olution 2577 (2021), is a necessary act by the inter-  
8       national community to stem the illicit transfer and  
9       destabilizing accumulation and misuse of small arms  
10      and light weapons in perpetuation of the conflict in  
11      South Sudan;

12                 (4) the United States should call on other mem-  
13       ber states of the United Nations to redouble efforts  
14       to enforce the United Nations arms embargo on  
15       South Sudan; and

16                 (5) the United States, through the United  
17       States Mission to the United Nations, should use its  
18       voice and vote in the United Nations Security Coun-  
19       cil in favor of maintaining the United Nations arms  
20       embargo on South Sudan until—

21                         (A) the Revitalized Agreement on the Res-  
22       olution of the Conflict in the Republic of South  
23       Sudan is fully implemented; or

(B) credible, fair, and transparent democratic elections are held in South Sudan.
