SEC UNITED STATES STRATEGY TO PREVENT AND RE-
SPOND TO GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE GLOB-
ALLY.
(a) GLOBAL STRATEGY REQUIREMENT.—Not later
than 180 days after the date of the enactment of this Act,
and biennially thereafter for 6 years, the Secretary of
State shall develop or update a United States global strat-
egy to prevent and respond to violence against women and
congressional committees and made publicly available on
the Internet.

1 (b) Initial Strategy.—For the purposes of this section, the "United States Strategy to Prevent and Respond to Gender-Based Violence Globally", issued in August 2012, shall be deemed to fulfill the initial requirement of subsection (a). 6 (c) COLLABORATION AND COORDINATION.—In developing the strategy under subsection (a), the Secretary of State shall consult with— 9 (1) the heads of relevant Federal agencies; 10 (2) the Senior Policy Operating Group on Trafficking in Persons; and 11 12 (3) representatives of civil society and multilat-13 eral organizations with demonstrated experience in addressing violence against women and girls or pro-14 15 moting gender equality internationally. 16 (d) Priority Country Selection.—To further the 17 objectives of the strategy described in subsection (a), the Secretary shall identify no less than 4 eligible low-income and lower-middle income countries with significant levels of violence against women and girls, including within displaced communities, that have the governmental or nongovernmental organizational capacity to manage and im-23 plement gender-based violence prevention and response 24 program activities and should, when possible, be geo-

1	graphically, ethnically, and culturally diverse from one an-
2	other.
3	(e) Implementation and Country Plans.—In
4	each country identified under subsection (d) the Secretary
5	shall develop and implement comprehensive, multisectoral,
6	and holistic individual country plans designed to address
7	and respond to violence against women and girls that in-
8	clude—
9	(1) an assessment and description of the cur-
10	rent or potential capacity of the government of each
11	identified country and civil society organizations in
12	each such identified country to address and respond
13	to violence against women and girls;
14	(2) an identification of coordination mecha-
15	nisms with Federal agencies that—
16	(A) have existing programs relevant to the
17	strategy;
18	(B) will be involved in new program activi-
19	ties; and
20	(C) are engaged in broader United States
21	strategies around development;
22	(3) a description of the monitoring and evalua-
23	tion mechanisms established for each identified
24	country, and their intended use in assessing overall
25	progress in prevention and response;

1	(4) a projection of the general levels of re-
2	sources needed to achieve the stated objectives in
3	each identified country, including an accounting of—
4	(A) activities and funding already ex-
5	pended by the Department of State, the United
6	States Agency for International Development,
7	other Federal agencies, donor country govern-
8	ments, and multilateral institutions; and
9	(B) leveraged private sector resources; and
10	(5) strategies, as appropriate, designed to ac-
11	commodate the needs of stateless, disabled, inter-
12	nally displaced, refugee, or religious or ethnic minor-
13	ity women and girls.
14	(f) PRIORITY COUNTRY SELECTION REPORT.—Not
15	more than 90 days after selection of the priority countries
16	required under subsection (d), and annually thereafter,
17	the Secretary of State shall submit to the appropriate con-
18	gressional committees a report detailing the priority coun-
19	try selection process, the implementation of specific coun-
20	try plans, and include an overview of all programming and
21	specific activities being undertaken, the budget resources
22	requested, and the specific activities to be supported by
23	each Executive agency under the strategy.
