RESOLUTION

Requesting information on Turkey's human rights practices in Syria pursuant to section 502B(c) of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961.

- 1 Resolved,
- 2 SECTION 1. REQUEST FOR INFORMATION ON TURKEY'S
- 3 HUMAN RIGHTS PRACTICES IN SYRIA.
- 4 (a) STATEMENT REQUIRED.—Not later than 30 days
- 5 after the date of the adoption of this resolution, the Sec-
- 6 retary of State shall, pursuant to section 502B(c) of the
- 7 Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2304(c)),
- 8 transmit to the Committee on Foreign Relations of the
- 9 Senate and the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the
- 10 House of Representatives a statement, prepared with the

1	assistance of the Assistant Secretary of State for Democ-
2	racy, Human Rights, and Labor and the Office of the
3	Legal Adviser, with respect to Turkey.
4	(b) Elements.—The statement submitted under
5	subsection (a) shall include the following elements:
6	(1) All available credible information concerning
7	alleged violations of internationally recognized
8	human rights by the Government of Turkey, its
9	armed forces, and associated groups and persons, in-
10	cluding the denial of the right to life in the context
11	of their activities in Syria caused by indiscriminate
12	or disproportionate operations, the infliction of civil-
13	ian casualties, and the displacement of civilian popu-
14	lations;
15	(2) A description of the steps the United States
16	Government has taken—
17	(A) to promote respect for and observance
18	of human rights as part of Turkey's activities
19	in Syria and discourage any practices that are
20	inimical to internationally recognized human
21	rights; and
22	(B) to publicly or privately call attention
23	to, and disassociate the United States and any
24	security assistance provided for Turkey from
25	such practices.

(3) An assessment, notwithstanding any such
practices, whether extraordinary circumstances exist
that necessitate a continuation of security assistance
for Turkey and, if so, a description of the cir-
cumstances and the extent to which the assistance
should be continued (subject to such conditions as
Congress may impose under section 502B of the
Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2304)).
(4) Other information, including—
(A) an assessment from the Secretary of
State of the likelihood that United States secu-
rity assistance, as defined in section 502B(d) of
the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C.
2304(d)), has been and will be used in Syria;
(B) a description of the extent to which
the activities of the Government of Turkey, its
armed forces, and associated groups or persons
have—
(i) caused, assisted, or resulted in the
release of ISIS fighters, supporters, and
other extremists from detention; or
(ii) promoted conditions that support,
assist or have resulted or could result in a
strengthening of the military capabilities of
such fighters and extremists within Syria,

1	including the practical control over terri-
2	tory;
3	(C) a description of the extent to which
4	such strengthening of such capabilities of ISIS
5	and other extremist groups and persons could
6	increase the threat to the United States, United
7	States citizens, and United States interests
8	both in the United States and abroad;
9	(D) a description of efforts by the Sec-
10	retary of State and other United States officials
11	to persuade the Government of Turkey to cease
12	its activities in Syria and commitments to sup-
13	port United States and multilateral efforts to
14	comprehensively defeat ISIS within Syria;
15	(E) a determination whether Turkey's pur-
16	chase and acceptance of delivery of the S-400
17	missile system from the Russian Federation
18	constitutes a "significant transaction" pursuant
19	to section 231 of the Countering America's Ad-
20	versaries Through Sanctions Act (22 U.S.C
21	9525);
22	(F) a description of any actions by the
23	Government of Turkey to forcibly repatriate
24	Syrian refugees; and

2	ment of Turkey is blocking humanitarian aid
3	from reaching communities in need of assist-
4	ance in northeast Syria.
