Internship Stipend

Senator Menendez is providing a \$5,000 stipend for a limited number of students to help alleviate the costs of interning with his Senate Foreign Relations Committee staff. Far too often, qualified students cannot afford to come intern in our offices because of the costs of housing, transportation, and food.

This stipend is intended only for those students who cannot afford to participate in an unpaid internship in Washington, D.C. While some students may have access to financial assistance from family or their educational institution, this stipend is intended for those who could not otherwise afford this opportunity.

The Senate Foreign Relations Committee minority staff office considers a financial need to exist in circumstances such as: when a student is eligible for a Pell Grant; when a student or a person claiming the student as a dependent is eligible for an Earned Income Tax Credit; when a student or a person claiming the student as a dependent lives at or below the federal poverty line; and other similar circumstances that may compel a student to decline to take an internship in D.C.
